## **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

WELLcome aimed to enhance the well-being and social inclusion of refugee children and youth in Finland through sport. The project provided sports clubs, coaches, and youth professionals with practical tools, training, and collaborative strategies to foster inclusive environments in sports. The guiding principle was that sport can be a powerful platform for integration, belonging, and community building.

The project was led by Finlands Svenska Idrott (FSI) in collaboration with Humak University of Applied Sciences, Åbo IFK, Turku Reception Center, local clubs, and third-sector actors.

Through training programs, community events, piloting, and knowledge-sharing, WELLcome created sustainable models for inclusive practice at both the local and national levels.





## METHODOLOGY: THE CREATION OF THE "WELLCOME - MODEL"

The project followed a structured multi-phase approach. The WELLCOME model was built iteratively with real-world testing, feedback, and refinement.


with key stakeholders like clubs, reception centers, municipalities. A diversity training program "Me as a Diversity Promoter" in Turku, then expanding to other regions.

Through club-led activities, low-threshold events, and training adaptations.

Participant surveys, interviews, and advisory group input informed improvements.

Via national and international dissemination platforms.







- 4,428 participants engaged through training, workshops, events, and outreach.
- 951 training participants, including club leaders, coaches, educators, and youth workers.
- Over 40 sports clubs actively participated across regions, piloting and adapting content.
- 199 refugee children and youth and their families joined club-led sports events.
- 15 club-led inclusion initiatives emerged, including multilingual materials, subsidized fees, non-discrimination plans, and onboarding processes for refugee families.
- WELLcome was showcased at major European forums such as European Youth & Sport Platform (Sweden), SocNet98 (Germany), and European Sport Platform (Kosovo).
- Final conference gathered 280 participants from 28 countries, with focused discussions on applying the WELLcome model across Europe.

 WELLcome Model: A publicly accessible digital toolkit covering seven themes related to diversity, inclusion, gender equality, and anti-racism in sport. It includes guidelines, templates, checklists, and video content (available in Swedish, Finnish, and English).


## • Training Programs:

- a. Me as a Diversity Promoter: Two-part sessions (theoretical & practical) focused on identity, inclusion barriers, and strategies for change.
- Respect in Sports: Popular module addressing behavior,
   safe spaces, and leadership values.
- c. Locker Room Pop-Up: Workshop and handbook to facilitate inclusive environments for youth.
- Local events: Introduction and low-threshold sports events organized in collaboration with reception centers and students, ensuring accessible engagement.
- Dissemination materials: Flyers, social media content, podcasts, training videos, and interactive sessions designed to support knowledge sharing.

## OUTPUTS AND INNOVATION







## THE WELLCOME MODEL

- The WELLcome model, a developed step-by-step model to create more inclusive sports clubs where everyone, regardless of their background, feels welcome.
- The model offers practical tips and methods to help sports clubs build a safer, more respectful, and inclusive environment.
- The model is divided into 6 topics: Values, action plan, recruitment, encounter, locker room pop up, integration and involvement.





## TRAINING PROGRAMS

- Me as a Diversity Promoter Two-part training (theory & practice) on identity, barriers to inclusion, and strategies for change. Piloted in several clubs, refined based on feedback, and proven effective in building inclusive leadership.
- 2. **Respect in Sports** Focuses on behavior, safe spaces, and leadership values. Provides coaches and leaders with concrete tools to strengthen respect and prevent discrimination in everyday sports environments.
- Locker Room Pop-Up Practical workshop and handbook with exercises for youth teams. Helps clubs create trust, teamwork, and inclusivity in daily training situations.





## **GET TO KNOW EVENTS**

- Low-threshold get to know events for refugee children and youth, where they can try out different sports that local clubs offer, especially the pilot club Åbo IFK.
- The events were held at the same or as close as possible to the actual training facilities, to make joining the club in the future as easy as possible.
- Parents and other adults had the opportunity to get to know the sports club, how to join the activities (time & place) and about the practical insights in joining a sports club.
- The participants of these events were contacted through reception centers, preparatory education and different local associations.
- Through these events Åbo IFK met 100 youth and children.

- Training materials are now integrated into academic programs at Humak University of Applied Sciences, shaping future coaches and social educators.
- Project tools and the WELLcome Model are being used as references by municipalities and federations aiming to increase diversity in sports.
- WELLcome's model and methods have inspired interest for replication and adaptation across Europe.
